ESSAY TOPICS / CRITERIA

CATEGORY I – Essay Contest for Grade 6th

Topic – Write your 300 –to-400-word essay on the following:

- **1.** What is Juneteenth?
- **2.** What family member or person did you ask about Juneteenth and how was the holiday explained?

CATEGORY II - Essay Contest for Grades 7th and 8th

Topic – Write your 400-to-500-word essay on the following:

- 1. What is Juneteenth?
- 2. Why do we celebrate this event?
- **3.** Think about and describe the historical significance of Juneteenth to the Black/African American culture in the United States.

CATEGORY III - Essay Contest for Grades 9th and 10th

Topic – Write your 500-to-600-word essay on the following:

- **1.** What is Juneteenth?
- **2.** Why is celebrating Juneteenth historically significant?
- **3**. What connections can be drawn between Juneteenth and modern-day social justice movements in the United States?

Essay Writing Requirements.

- Essays must be the student's original work. Plagiarism will not be accepted.
- Juneteenth values the importance of creativity and the value of having one's own thoughts put to paper and for that reason the use of AI (artificial intelligence) is not acceptable in essay writing. The use of AI makes the knowledge of a student ineffective, enforces risk of plagiarism, and disregards the invaluable role of human originality and ethics in academic writing. You will be asked to sign a statement before submitting your essay that you have not used AI in writing your essay. We do use tools to help evaluate whether the use of AI has been used. If our results show this to be the case, your essay will be disqualified from the competition.
- Essay must be complete and formatted per the student application checklist (see application).
 - o Typed in 12 pt. or 14 pt. Times New Roman or Arial font
 - o Double spaced with a bibliography listing all references used.
 - Word count cannot be less than or exceed category range.
 - o Submitted on Word or as PDF document only.
- Essay must have a title and stay on the topic. Essays will be judged on the correct use of grammar, spelling, punctuation, and originality.
- Maps, drawings, pictures, and graphics should not be included.

ENTRY SUBMISSIONS & AWARD ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Entries received after April 12th, 2025 will not be eligible and will not be returned.
- Essay submissions can be submitted to the Juneteenth website (www.lansingjuneteenthcelebration.org) from February 24th April 12th, 2025. Please check website for drop off locations for hard copies.
- The Juneteenth Essay Award program will be held on June 18th, 2025, location to be announced, Time 6:00 PM.
- Any student having previously won an award is ineligible for entry into the same category, however, the student is eligible if moving to a new category. Ex: From Category I to Category II or Category III to Category IV.
