Conclusion 0-5 points  ☐ Is your conclusion brief and to the point? ☐ Did you restate your thesis and summarize your main idea? ☐ Did you bring your thoughts and ideas to an effective conclusion?
Grammar and Spelling 0-5 points  Is your  grammar correct? spelling correct? punctuation correct?
ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION
Proofreading is one of the keys to writing success.  □ Did you read your essay out loud to yourself slowly?  It's important to ask two people you trust to read your essay. They are not allowed to make corrections but they can tell you where your writing isn't clear.  □ Did someone else proofread your essay? (For example, a family member, teacher, or mentor)
